The Christ the Teacher Institute houses Sheil's principal education and formation programs. Its primary mission is to form Catholic leaders for the Church and the world through the integration of scholarship, prayer, service and leadership. The Institute offers opportunities for learners of all ages to deepen their faith and integrate it into their day-to-day lives. Intellectually stimulating seminars and speakers give all students, associates, and Northwestern community members a chance to explore Catholicism and faith from a wide variety of approaches and contexts. **Scholarship:** Colorado Christian University President's Scholarship

**Application Deadline** Varies **Amount:** \$64,000

Colorado Christian University funds a variety of scholarships and grants for qualifying students in the College of Undergraduate Studies. Prospective students should complete their application for admission and submit their FAFSA by the priority date of April 1. Applicants to CCU will automatically be considered for academic scholarships. Scholarships are awarded evenly by semester, and students must be enrolled each semester to be eligible. Available scholarships and grant awards are determined by the year in which a student first enrolled at CCU. CCU awards academic scholarships to new freshmen who meet specific academic requirements and are guaranteed for up to eight semesters as long as the student maintains satisfactory academic progress and is continuously enrolled in CCU's College of Undergraduate Studies. Applicants of the President's Scholarship must have a 3.6 GPA, and usually have a minimum ACT composite score of 24 or SAT score of 1190 (test scores are optional). To maintain eligibility, students must keep a minimum 3.3 GPA and meet student aid eligibility requirements.

**Scholarship:** Beta Sigma Psi University of Missouri Rush Scholarship

**Application Deadline** 6/30/2024 **Amount:** \$1,000

This scholarship is intended for Christian men who are enrolling full time at Mizzou for the upcoming academic year. The scholarship(s) is awarded annually to young men who demonstrate the ideals of a Christian gentlemen. Along with the application, the applicant may wish to provide a letter of reference from the applicants' pastor, a Beta Sigma Psi alumnus, or a teacher, though this is not required. Applicants will be contacted about scheduling an interview, as applications are received. The interviews will take place at a time and place that works for both the interviewee and interviewers. This scholarship is made possible by the Columbia Alumni Chapter of Beta Sigma Psi. Applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale and beginning their first year at the University of Missouri - Columbia. The award is contingent upon the applicant demonstrating the ideals of a Christian gentlemen and will be distributed during the first semester living in the Chapter House. Scholarship: John W. McDevitt Scholarship

The Knights of Columbus awards scholarships annually. To be eligible for scholarships, applicants must: be entering their freshmen year of a four-year, undergraduate program, leading to a bachelor's degree, at a Catholic college or Catholic university, in the United States; and be a member in good standing of the Knights of Columbus, a son or daughter of such a member, or of a such a deceased member, who at the time of death, was in good standing, or a Columbian Squire in good standing. The John W. McDevitt Scholarship Fund was established in tribute to the 11th Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, John W. McDevitt, a distinguished educator during his career prior to becoming Deputy Supreme Knight and then Supreme Knight in 1964. Earnings of the established fund provide undergraduate scholarships of \$1,500 per year to selected applicants. U.S. awardees and non-awardees will be notified in late May of the Scholarship Committee's decision.

**Scholarship:** Pro Deo and Pro Patria Scholarships

The Knights of Columbus awards scholarships annually. To be eligible for scholarships, applicants must: be entering their freshmen year of a four-year, undergraduate program, leading to a bachelor's degree, at a Catholic college or Catholic university, in the United States; and be a member in good standing of the Knights of Columbus, a son or daughter of such a member, or of a such a deceased member, who at the time of death, was in good standing, or a Columbian Squire in good standing. At its 1965 meeting in Baltimore, Maryland, the Supreme Council established the Pro Deo and Pro Patria Scholarship Trust to provide undergraduate scholarships at The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C., with scholarships available to members and sons and daughters of members and two scholarships available to Columbian Squires. The program now includes other Catholic colleges and universities. U.S. awardees and non-awardees will be notified in late May of the Scholarship Committee's decision.

**Scholarship:** ECF Fellowship Partners Program

The Episcopal Church Foundation has supported over 200 scholars and ministry leaders throughout the Episcopal Church, fostering innovation in the theological formation and ministerial leadership in challenging times. The applicant should be seeking: specialized training in a vocation or technical school; a degree of certification below the master's level at a college or university; or continuing education courses for upgrading job skills either in an educational institution or special training agency. While preference is given to Episcopalians, non-Episcopalians may apply so long as they are sponsored by a member of an Episcopal church. The Episcopal Church Women in the Diocese of North Carolina are dedicated to sharing the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ by engaging in worship, prayer, study, service and fellowship. The Diocesan ECW administers and helps fund the Lex Mathews Scholarship program, named for the Rev. Lex Mathews who advocated for women's issues and headed Christian Social Ministries for the Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina before his death in 1985.

Scholarship: Leonard M. Perryman Communications Scholarship for Racial Ethnic Minori

The Leonard M. Perryman Communications Scholarship for Racial Ethnic Minority Students awards a scholarship for the undergraduate study of religion journalism or mass communications. The scholarship assists a United Methodist undergraduate who intends to pursue a career in religion journalism through study at an accredited U.S. college or university. Applicants must be a United Methodist ethnic minority student enrolled at the junior or senior level in the journalism or communications department of an accredited college or university in the United States. Applicants are judged on five criteria: Christian commitment and involvement in the life of the United Methodist Church; academic achievement as revealed by transcripts, grade point averages and the required letters of reference; journalistic experience and/or evidence of journalistic talent; clarity of purpose in plans and goals for the future; and the potential professional ability as a religion journalist.

Scholarship: Stoody-West Graduate Fellowship

**Application Deadline** 3/15/2024 **Amount:** \$6,000

The Stoody-West Graduate Fellowship will assist one United Methodist student in their post-graduate study at an accredited U.S. college or university who intends on pursuing a career in religious journalism. Applicants must be a United Methodist who intends to pursue a career in religion journalism and is enrolled in post-graduate study at a school in the United States. (The term "religion journalism" includes news writing for secular and church media and for church institutions. The committee will consider appropriate news and journalism forms, including electronic and broadcast media, as well as print.) The Stoody-West Fellowships in religious journalism are offered in recognition of the work and lives of Dr. Ralph Stoody and Dr. Arthur West, who were leaders in public relations and information services in The United Methodist Church. The purpose of the fellowship is to enhance the recipient's professional competence and thereby help to perpetuate the standards exemplified by Ralph Stoody and Arthur West.

Scholarship: Morris J. and Betty Kaplun Foundation Essay Contest

To be eligible for the Estelle Beaumont Ellison Scholarship, a student must be a full-time student, of good moral character, exhibit academic excellence (based on the ability of each student), evidence financial need, and regularly participate in a Christian church. All applicants must also be residents of the greater San Antonio area. Applicants must be residents of the greater San Antonio area and be full-time students. The Marie A. Calderilla Scholarship was created to enable women to pursue courses of study that they would otherwise be unable to follow due to limited financial means. The selection committee looks for academic promise, women who have demonstrated a commitment to completing a degree or certificate program or to increasing their work skills, and personal characteristics such as honesty, good judgment and perseverance. Recipients are eligible for up to three years of funding; however, students must meet renewal requirements to continue to receive the award. Students enrolled in a four-year degree program at a San Mateo County Community College District college are eligible for up to four years of funding. If the student's combined grant funding from federal, state and institutional sources is already greater than or equal to the amount of their Middle Class Scholarship eligibility, the student will be ineligible for the scholarship.

In arguing in the U.S. Senate for passage of NSEP, Boren expressed his view that the U.S. needed a large increase in experts in the languages and cultures of nations which were underrepresented in the number of U.S. students studying there. With changes in the world, Boren felt that the U.S. would work more and more through partnerships with other countries whose needs and perspectives needed to be more fully understood.

The intent of the Luce Scholars Program is to provide an in-depth experience in Asia to young Americans who would not otherwise have the opportunity to immerse themselves in the country where they are placed. Eligible applicants must: be U.S. citizens or permanent residents; and may be graduating seniors, recent graduates, or young professionals under the age of 32, or if older than 32, candidates must have received their bachelor's degree within the past three years. The Luce Scholars Program is a nationally competitive fellowship program. It was launched by the Henry Luce Foundation in 1974 to enhance the understanding of Asia among potential leaders in American society. The program provides stipends, language training, and individualized professional placement in Asia for 18 Luce Scholars each year, and welcomes applications from college seniors, graduate students, and young professionals in a variety of fields who have had limited exposure to Asia.
